

How do you see the future of the parish?

What do you like about the parish? What do you think needs changing?

Our Parish Council, in line with good practice, is producing a Parish Plan that sets out priorities over the next few years. Jeff Channing and Jacquie Horne are leading on this. A draft has been produced and is available by contacting them, or by going to the website www.ukvillages.co.uk/mottisfont-hampshire (select "Notice Board", then "Mottisfont and Dunbridge Draft Parish Plan").

What's the plan for? It's a way of finding out what the parish thinks - this is your opportunity to tell the parish council what you think is important. And it helps us to work with others (such as Test Valley BC), who have the resources to deliver what we want.

This is an important document, which could help determine the future of the parish, and we want to hear from you. We also want to form a small group to comment on our thinking so we can be sure to reflect views.

Speed limits: A 30mph speed limit in the village centre has been agreed by Hampshire County Council and should be implemented soon. The Parish Council is concerned about the accident rate on the B3084, and intends to propose an extension of the 30mph limit by downgrading the current 40mph limit to 30mph. It is currently working on the statistics to support its case. If you support this, please let your Parish Council know. Your Feedback is important!

Speeding: The Parish Council is also concerned about speeding in the parish. One thought is the use of Vehicle Speed Check equipment that flashes when a vehicle exceeds the speed restriction, but there are cost implications here. Again, your views are welcome – are these signs effective short/long term, are they worth paying for? Let your Parish Council know your views.

Footpaths: Andrew Simmonds on behalf of the Parish Council has undertaken a couple of surveys, which provide good evidence of the need for a footway at Barley Hill, and the further extension of the existing one at Hatt Hill. Before approaching the authorities, possible funding sources are now being explored.

Parish Plan: A draft plan has been produced and is now open for public consultation. If anyone is keen to contribute, contact either Jeff Channing or Jacquie Horne, who will be pleased to consult with you.

ACORN Costs: The Parish Council has agreed to pay the costs of production (*phew! - Ed.*) until suitable **sponsorship is found to cover it. It is hopeful to obtain a grant from your County Councillor's Members Budget to fund it. Fingers crossed!**


Congratulations to Sherfield English WI, who were the worthy winners of the group skittles match in November.


