Diana Warnock gave a very interesting talk on "What the Bride Wore" - a visual history of the wedding dress. This started with one of the oldest paintings of a wedding couple - Matilda, the 16 year old daughter of Henry I, who married the Holy Roman Emperor in about 1118 - through the centuries to the present day. The elaborate dresses of the medieval period, contrasting with the simplicity of the Georgian period, were very well illustrated. The wedding dress of the bride was often the "best dress", to be worn again as best. The talk finished with pictures of "way-out" wedding dresses by ultra-modern designers - I doubt they were ever worn!

We are looking forward to our day trips to Bath, Dublin and the Law Courts in London.

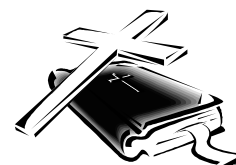

Dear Friends,



This Lent as a Benefice we are placing Prayer at the heart of our preparation. Lent is a good time to develop or strengthen a discipline of daily prayer. The Liturgy of the Hours, an ancient practice of praying throughout the day, is a good place to start thinking about this subject. An excellent goal for Lent would be to read Morning Prayer or Evening Prayer every day. (You can find this in your Book of Common Prayer.) It is also available in Christian Bookshops as Morning Prayer Common Worship, which is in more modern English. If you already use Morning Prayer, perhaps you could add noon or night prayer (also called Compline). Gina and I have copies of Compline if you would like to borrow one. There is also Contemplative prayer, based around the idea of silence or listening for God, and is also well suited to Lent. There are also many excellent form prayers that reflect the penitential mood of Lent. The Psalms are a type of form prayer and a wonderful resource readily available for this purpose. Psalm 6, Psalm 32, Psalm 38, Psalm 51, Psalm 102, Psalm 130, Psalm 143. All of these magnificent psalms can be offered up as Lenten Prayers to God on a daily basis. Remember, reading your bible and prayer should always go along with making an effort to attend worship services whenever possible.

To help you with your Lenten Prayer, on **7th March at the beginning of Lent** we are holding a **Benefice Prayer Day at St Mary's, Broughton**, 10.00am to 4.00pm. We will have a full program and you can join in as much or as little as you like.

The program is:

- 10.00am Coffee
- 10.30am Common Worship and leading Intercessions in Public Worship
- 12 noon Lunch (provided)
- 1.00pm The Saints and Prayer led by The Revd Canon David Scott
- 2.00pm Coffee
- 2.30pm Prayer without Words, Contemplative and Meditational Prayer led by Richard Evans
- 4.00pm Finish

We hope that many will come and sample this special day in preparation for Lent.

The Thomas Dowse Trust was created to provide people up to the age of 25 years with financial assistance towards educational requirements. Awbridge First Responders Newsletter

Awbridge First Responders held their 3rd AGM on 12th February. This gave us an opportunity to reflect on the past three years and everything that has been achieved, not only by the existing Responders but also the Responders who started the group, the fundraisers and everyone who supported us with their donations and time, attending our jumble sale, barn dance, quiz night and various coffee mornings.

After three years our finances are in good shape, we have two full kits and a full training kit. The only missing element is Responders. We still desperately need volunteers to ensure full rota cover. At present we can only cover three nights some weeks, with some Responders covering many more rota slots than the minimum requirement.

Are you a reluctant volunteer because you are unsure of exactly what is involved? Although we are very fortunate to have some nurses as Responders, the majority of us have absolutely no previous medical experience. South Central Ambulance ensures that all Responders are adequately trained, initially with a two day course, and then follow-ups every six months with re-qualifications. Responders always operate in pairs

at night, and are only directed to appropriate calls by the Ambulance Service with full support if required.

My last call illustrates perfectly the skills needed for the majority of the calls we have attended. The incident involved a very elderly person who had fallen. I was able to offer oxygen to help ease pain, but all they wanted was my hand and reassurance that I was not going to leave them. If you were alone, how grateful would you be to hold someone's hand?

Please, if you have a spare hand, we need you.
