😹 National Trust

Update on proposed new visitor facilities, visitor car park, Mottisfont Abbey:

The National Trust will be progressing with the preparation of detailed drawings for the new development over the next 3 months, with the aim of being able to show them to local residents in the autumn (around November) and moving onto the planning application stage by the end of the year. We'll give notice of when the drawings will be available for view via Acorn, and will welcome informal views and feedback from you. Of course, you'll also have the opportunity to comment when the scheme is submitted to Test Valley Borough Council for planning permission. The scheme is slightly smaller than we originally proposed, with a much reduced size of catering building, but otherwise, the layout will be as first shown.

Home alarm systems - watch out for high pressure sales

The following is an extract from a report forwarded by a Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator at Hampshire Constabulary, whose comments are shown in italics.

"(The caller) offered to give me a free Honeywell security alarm system which would not only detect the start of a fire but would automatically phone the fire station and a fire engine would be dispatched immediately. (*The Fire Service do not do this.*) The alarm would also detect the house being broken into and automatically be directly connected to the police. (*The Police do not do this.*)

"(The caller) stated that the alarm would normally cost £1,000 but due to a special once a year offer is free to the over 50s (How did he know my age group?) (Because the company bought a list from another unscrupulous company). He wanted to pencil in an appointment for a trained security installer named Robert recognised by the police to visit and give a free 20 minute demonstration. He said the installers were in ********* Avenue and ********** Drive this week He stated that the installers were here for only one week and didn't want me to miss this opportunity for a free alarm system. (*Pressure sales.*)

REDCURRANT ROULADE

These tart berries, ripe for the picking mid-summer, are an attractive addition to any dessert.

The best way to strip the berries from their woody stalks is to use the prongs of a fork.

This recipe serves 8 persons.

Ingredients

6 large egg whites 250g caster sugar Half a tablespoonful of custard powder A little splash of white wine vinegar Half a teaspoonful of vanilla essence 350ml double cream 300g redcurrants, stalks removed lcing sugar for dusting

How to make it

First, make sure that your mixing bowl and whisk are absolutely clean and free from any grease or fat.

Whisk the egg whites until they start to fluff up and then slowly add the caster sugar and custard powder. Continue to whisk, and when the egg whites are at the stiff peaks stage, add the white wine vinegar.

Now spread this mixture evenly on a greaseproofpaper lined Swiss roll tin (a flat baking tray about 42cm/16" x 30cm/12"). Bake in a moderate oven at 185°C (165°C fan)/Gas Mark 4 to 5 for 10 minutes.

Remove from the oven and allow to cool on the tray.

Next, add the vanilla essence to the double cream and whip until thickened. Spread the whipped cream gently over the cooled meringue and then sprinkle evenly with the redcurrants.

With the long edge in front of you, carefully bring the far edge of the meringue towards you using the greaseproof paper to help you roll it over.

Give the roulade a good dusting with icing sugar, cut across into portions, wiping your knife clean each time.

Serve with extra chopped fruit or a coulis.
