Parish Council News

At our Annual General Meeting, John Millns was unanimously re-elected as Chairman, and Jeff Channing as Vice Chairman.

Diversions Routes

Whilst the Kimbridge railway crossing was closed recently, the traffic was diverted through the village centre. Previously the council has requested that no heavy vehicles should be directed through the village centre but use the B3084 instead. We do understand that on these occasions it is difficult to differentiate between sizes of vehicles, however. Hampshire County Council made the comment that whilst it is not their practice to re-direct traffic through the village centre, it is not their policy and they received no complaints during this particular period.

Upgraded Dunbridge Sewerage Treatment Plant

Further to the Chairman's annual report in May, it was brought to our attention that the work at Dunbridge is not yet complete! Southern Electric and the National Trust need to agree between themselves the installation of the permanent power supply cable for the site. A generator is being used to provide power until the permanent installation takes place.

We have now been given a date for the electrical installation by Southern Electric of 29th July 2013, with approximately 3 weeks for the installation. The site is expected to be completely finished by mid-September

Lengthsman

A new Lengthsman has been appointed for the year, and we have a budget of £1000 again from Hampshire County Council. He will be assigned the following jobs:

- ▶ To cut the grass behind Russell Drive at the play area;
- ▶ To clear the ditch along the Lockerley Road;
- ▶ To cut the grass along the verge at the bottom of Barley Hill;
- ▶ To cut the grass on the Bengers Road corner;
- ▶ To tidy Hatt Lane and take away any cuttings;
- ▶ To clean the bus shelter, signs and name plates;
- ▶ To tidy the unmade part of Church Lane.

News from Mottisfont

Well, the roses are just coming into their best! The ramblers are all out along the walls, and the shrub roses are starting to appear now. While nature is very much behind her usual schedule out in the wilds, the timing of the roses is not so far off within the sheltered area of our walled garden, so we're expecting peak flowering to start when it usually does, around 22nd June.

New sounds inspired by birdsong in the Cellarium

From 22nd June, visitors will also be able to experience a new sound environment in the Cellarium, our oldest medieval room. Composer and sonic artist Hywel Davies has been working at Mottisfont as artist in residence for the last three months. His new sound-based art work has been inspired by the birdsong of Mottisfont's dawn chorus, which he's been recording every week since early spring. He was also interested in the music that would have been sung in the 13th-century priory by Augustinian priests, as they celebrated the arrival of each morning.

His sound piece has been recorded by Kokoro (Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra's new music ensemble) and by Mottisfont's own choir, made up from volunteers and staff. We're not as famous as the Military Wives, but we've been having a wonderful time getting together round the Whistler Room piano every Tuesday for the last 3 months, singing everything from 1930s pop classics to early folk songs. We recorded the new song fragments that Hywel has written for the final piece last week in St. Andrews – many thanks to Gill Nobes for allowing us to record in this very special place! The words for our songs came out of workshops with families from Romsey Home Educators, all about what they were thankful for as each morning begins.

The installation has been created as part of Mottisfont's resident artist programme, A Place for Art, which is supported by Arts Council England, and will be in place until November. The sounds that visitors hear will constantly change as they move slowly around the Cellarium, completely immersing them in the experience – come and see what you think!

Also, if you haven't been in to see our Boys' Room, do pop in and have a look – Kerry, Angela and the House team have been adding all sorts of items to decorate it, the sorts of things the Russell boys would have had in their room for relaxing in the 1930s. There are all sorts of things to discover – hope we'll see you in there soon.

The Broughton and Mottisfont Village Bus has been in operation for more than 30 years, providing a useful service to local villagers. It takes about 30 people to keep it operating, from the cheerful ladies who organise the driving rotas or take bookings for the summer excursions to the Treasurer who counts the pennies and keeps us honest. The largest category of volunteer is that of the drivers, of whom there are 20 plus. We are very well served by these drivers, but inevitably there is a need for periodic refreshment of the list. Some move away from the area and some (surprisingly) grow old and want to spend more time with their families.

This note is to appeal to anyone who might be interested to come forward to volunteer as a driver. The commitment is not onerous. A driver might be asked to do one of our routes (Romsey, Salisbury, Southampton, Winchester or Andover) on about 10 occasions a year. No special licence is required; we operate on the normal car licence enhanced by a short session of refresher (known as MiDAS) and familiarisation with the bus.

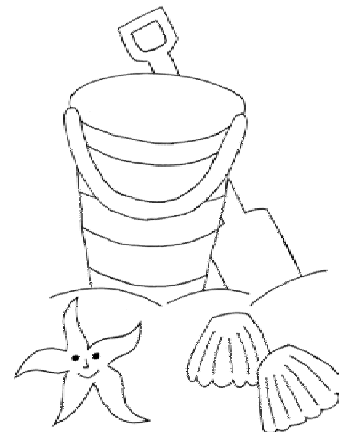

SEA SUNDAY SPECIAL SERVICE

Everyone is invited to join us for this action packed worship. We look forward to seeing you.

Are you interested in being confirmed?

In September we will be starting a group for people who are interested in being confirmed, and we will be holding a Confirmation Service at St. Mary's Broughton on Sunday 23rd November.

Q. But what's confirmation?

A. Confirmation marks the point in the Christian journey at which you affirm for yourself the faith into which you have been baptized and your intention to live a life of committed discipleship. This affirmation is confirmed through prayer and the laying on of hands by the confirming bishop. The Church also asks God to give you power through the Holy Spirit to enable you to live in the way of Jesus.

Q. I was baptized as a child, why do I need to be confirmed?

A. If you were baptized as a child, in confirmation you are confirming the promises your parents made on your behalf at your baptism about your commitment to a journey of faith. In confirming this faith you are becoming a member of the local and worldwide Christian family. In turn the Church will promise to support and pray for you.

In confirmation we recall the promises made at baptism; we are thanking God for his gift of life and publicly acknowledging his love. We are acknowledging that we all need to turn away from selfishness and evil and to accept God's offer of a new start.

If you were not baptized as a child and want to make a commitment of faith, you can be baptized and confirmed in the same service.

Q. What happens during confirmation groups?

A. The purpose of confirmation preparation is to ensure that those who are confirmed have a proper understanding of what it means to live as a disciple of Christ within the life of the Church of England. Today, preparation focuses on enabling people to live a life of committed discipleship in a world of multimedia and globalised culture. Sessions encourage candidates to grow in their Christian faith through prayer, reflection, studying the Bible, participating actively in the life of the church and demonstrating their faith in their communities.

KIMBRIDGE RESTAURANT

White chocolate and strawberry cheesecake

This recipe serves 8 people.

Ingredients:

200g melted white chocolate
400g full fat soft cheese
250g roughly chopped strawberries
1½ packets of digestive biscuits
50g melted butter
100g double cream

How to make it:

Grease the edges of an 8 inch loose tin and line with baking paper. Place the digestives in a blender and blitz until all broken up (or place the biscuits in a sealed bag and hit with a rolling pin until all broken up). Next, melt the butter, mix the crushed biscuits and butter together, and place evenly in the bottom of the tin. Put the tin in the fridge to chill whilst making the filling.

Place the cream cheese in a mixer and mix until soft. Add the cream to loosen the cheese and once thoroughly mixed, melt the white chocolate and leave to cool slightly. Once cool, pour into the cheese mix and gently combine the two. If the mixture is not sweet enough, you can add a little icing sugar.

Cut the strawberries into quarters and fold through the white chocolate mix gently so as not to break up the strawberries too much.

Retrieve the base from the fridge. Then place the cheesecake mix on top of the base and knock gently on the table top so that any air at the bottom of the tin is removed. Now spread the mixture evenly over the top and place the cheesecake back into the fridge and chill for a least 4 hours (or overnight for best results). Once chilled, remove the cheesecake from the tin, discard the paper lining. Using a hot clean knife, cut the cheesecake, wiping the knife each time so you get a clean cut, and serve.

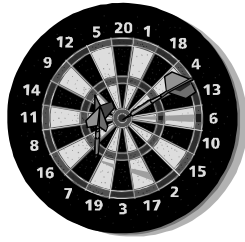
