Lockerley Primary School is situated on the edge of the beautiful Test Valley. The school retains some of the original Victorian buildings, along with more modern extensions to create 4 full time classrooms, a music room, a well-stocked library, a multi-purpose hall and the latest addition to the building, the 'Monarch Room' used for small group work and the home of the Breakfast and After School clubs. All children have access to chromebooks, laptops and iPads. There is a well-equipped playground, a sports field and a beautiful garden. We offer our children a rich and meaningful learning experience that enables them to develop their self-esteem and maximise their potential as young people.

We have close links with St. John's Church in the village, and the Parish Vicar plays an active part in the life of the school. The school uses the church frequently for special assemblies.

If you are looking for a school place we do have some spaces for year R in September 2021 and currently a few places in years 1, 3, 4, 5 & 6.

The Thomas Dowse's Trust is able to provide grants to individuals, up to the age of 25, living in Broughton, Bossington, Mottisfont and Dunbridge, for educational purposes towards the cost of such things as uniform, school trips, music tuition, overseas educational trips, swimming lessons, transport to educational establishments, laptops and books. Applications are treated in strict confidence. Applicants must demonstrate need, but there is no means testing.

The Mill Arms

It is hard to believe that it will be over six months from when we last called time to when we finally reopen our doors in May.

As we are all aware, certain dates have been set as "no earlier than" in the Government roadmap, and with regards to hospitality we have been advised that outside spaces may be used no earlier than 12th April, with the "Rule of 6" and "table service only" both being mandatory. The next unlocking step is effective no earlier than 17th May and will allow indoor use, still under the "Rule of 6" and "table service only", but with up to 30 people allowed outside.

While we have considerable outdoor space at the Mill Arms, given the vagaries of the English weather and the restrictive requirements still in place, we do not feel that opening under such tight restrictions on 12th April is of benefit to either our staff or customers. It is our desire for the pub experience to be as near to normal as possible when we welcome you back through our doors.

From the Rector

Happy Easter!

You may well be reading this in Holy Week. Happy Easter! At the beginning of April there is Good News in the life of the Church. Not only are we celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ once more, also here in the MidTest benefice we have reopened the churches for public worship. Distinct from 2020's on-line Easter celebration, this year we are able to worship together in church.

As you would expect, strict procedures will be in place to protect public health in church. In particular, it will be necessary to make a booking if you want to come to church on Easter Sunday – please contact one of your local churchwardens for more details, and of course, hand sanitiser and masks and distanced seating will be required.

The national public health situation gives us cause for hope, as the rollout of vaccinations continues at pace and prevalence of the virus continues to decline. It seems appropriate, as we celebrate Easter, to have such a cause for hope. However, we would do well to reflect on Jesus' followers' reaction to the news of the resurrection. At first, they were confused and unsure – some were disbelieving, and others responded by hiding indoors in fear. Our response to the good news on public health should be equally cautious.

This Easter, there is Good News. This Easter we have reason for hope. This Easter we can look forward to new future and a changed world. Yet we need to recognise the cost that has been paid for this Good News, the pain and suffering that that has brought it about, and the need to ensure that it is Good News for all people. Nightingale Lodge - Extra Care scheme in Romsey

New homes for older people in Romsey are nearing completion following a partnership between Hampshire County Council (HCC), Test Valley Borough Council TVBC) and Places for People.

Nightingale Lodge includes 54 new homes, including 34 for affordable rent and 17 for shared ownership, and are available for persons over 55 who have eligible care and support needs.
