



DON'T FORGET YOUR VOTER ID!

Elections will be held on Thursday 4th May for all the seats on Test Valley Borough Council, and on Parish and Town Councils across the Test Valley area. By law, all residents will need to show photographic ID when they go to a polling station before they receive their ballot paper.



People can use various forms of photographic ID, including a driving licence, passport, Older Person's Bus Pass, a blue badge or Disabled Person's Bus Pass. The full list of accepted ID can be found at www.testvalley.gov.uk/voterID.

Residents can also use expired ID as long as the photograph is still a good likeness.

Anyone who doesn't have an accepted form of identification can apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate (VAC) at www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate.

Those unable to apply online can contact TVBC's electoral services team to request a paper form on 01264 368000 or 01794 527700, or by emailing elecereg@testvalley.gov.uk.

Anyone who needs help completing the VAC form in person can also visit the council offices at Beech Hurst in Andover or the Former Magistrates' Court in Romsey.

The deadline to apply for a VAC for the Test Valley borough elections set to be held on 4 May 2023 is Tuesday 25 April, *but residents are being encouraged to apply as soon as possible*.

There will be no need for people to provide photographic ID if they vote by post.

For people with a proxy vote, which is where someone else votes on their behalf, then their proxy will need to provide their own ID, not the elector's.

What's On at Mottisfont

**For families...
Mottisfont's Easter fete
1 – 16 April, 10am-5pm**

Treat the whole family to a world of adventure at Mottisfont on our Easter trail, inspired by the classic village fete. Our trail is packed with traditional springtime activities, including egg rolling, bean bag throwing, and other energetic outdoor games, plus spring-themed crafts.

Normal admission plus £3 per trail includes a trail map, pencil and a chocolate egg, or vegan and free from chocolate egg, made here in the UK from cocoa that's responsibly sourced from Rainforest Alliance Certified farms.

In the gardens...

Daffodils bloom beneath our giant plane trees and brighten up the beds of the winter garden. The parterre in front of the house is filled with Delft Blue hyacinths, and a flood of tiny star-shaped chionodoxa sweeps down the lime avenue in early spring. 15 Mount Fuji cherry trees burst into frothy white blossom in April. This small orchard is established in a bio-diverse meadow which reveals bright spots of colour from narcissi and fritillaries. Tulips flower in the walled gardens, and the Kitchen Garden is planted with produce once the risk of frost has passed. The first roses start to emerge in May, particularly wall-climbing varieties, building up to rose season in June.

Looking ahead to rose season, we'll be offering extended opening hours again, with the gardens open until 8pm on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays from 1 June - 1 July.

We're celebrating the legacy of one of Britain's most popular cartoonists, Norman Thelwell, with a new exhibition for his centenary year. Thelwell's much-loved ponies and other humorous illustrations will be on show, alongside exquisitely rendered local landscapes, including the village of Mottisfont and other local landmarks. The exhibition features over 50 artworks, many never shown before, and takes visitor on a journey through the artist's life, from childhood sketches, painting equipment, and family memories, to an exploration into the subjects Thelwell felt passionately about, including environmental concerns and his love of the countryside.

From the Rector

At the time of writing this piece, four people who have been living on my street have passed away. This is unusual and surprising, but surely just a sad coincidence. Friday 14 April, 7.30pm Decision To Leave (15)

From a mountain peak in South Korea, a man plummets to his death. Did he jump, or was he pushed? When detective Hae-joon arrives on the scene, he begins to suspect the dead man's wife Seo-rae. TREETOP FUN COMES TO SPEARYWELL WOOD

In a bid to improve countryside recreation facilities, treetop walkways and zipwires are to be installed in Spearywell Wood.

The controversial decision to proceed with this project was made at short notice as the end of the financial year approached. At that point it became clear that the recreation facilities budget was showing an unexpected underspend, and the principle of "use it or lose it" should be applied.

A spokesperson said, "This new state-of-the-art facility will turn Spearywell Wood into a very popular attraction, so we will be expanding the car parking area to cope with the increase in the number of visitors". It is anticipated that the increased traffic level may at last lead to improvement of the B3084, something that local people have been campaigning to achieve for many years.

Noting that the wood is widely used by dog-walkers, it has been agreed that owners may take their dogs onto the overhead walkways and zipwires, provided that all dogs wear a specially developed harness that not only keeps them safe from falling off, but also retains any "rear end substances", as they have euphemistically been described. A range of harnesses will be available, covering Chihuahuas to Great Danes, but owners will be responsible for fitting them. The harnesses are expected to eliminate any claims for cleaning or replacement clothing costs from those walking below.

Work is due to start on 1st April 2023.

The February speaker was unable to come, so local historian, Phoebe Merrick stepped into the breach and gave a most interesting talk on 'Royalty and Romsey.'

She began her talk by giving a brief resume of the Abbey's history, beginning around 900AD when King Alfred's granddaughter was the first Abbess, and mentioned that there are pillar capitals and kneelers in the Abbey depicting early royal visitors to the church.

She then moved on to visits by more recent royalty, showing slides of Queen Elizabeth II and Princess Margaret when they were bridesmaids at the wedding of Lord Louis' elder daughter, and some of the regular visits by the late Queen and her husband Prince Philip.

There were slides depicting the way in which Romsonians celebrated royal events. Images of tea parties for the last coronation and street parties for the late Queen's diamond jubilee had WI members searching for familiar faces.

In March we had another local speaker, Roger Savage from Choice Plants at Timsbury. Roger gave a potted autobiography of his life before setting up his nursery. His early life in India instilled a love of colour, and he found his first job with a law firm to be too drab and grey. He therefore changed his idea of

a law degree to one in horticulture, which he thoroughly enjoyed. The world of horticulture opened up a wealth of opportunities, and after working for a fruit grower in Suffolk (where he lived on a bus), he worked for ICI, which increased his confidence in building relationships with others.

Eventually, in 1989, he and his wife, Mary, bought a plot of land and opened Choice Plants. It was VERY hard work, and he was soon busy supplying hanging baskets to Sainsbury's Homebase stores nationwide, and about 60 pubs around the south - at the peak, around 15,000 hanging baskets!

The seasonal nature of the business meant he was forced to diversify, and opened the Poppies Cafe and a craft centre within the nursery. There is now an ice cream parlour as well, which proves popular in the summer. All of his talk was peppered with amusing anecdotes which caused great hilarity among the members.

There are trips in the offing to Plaza Theatre productions, a visit to Mottisfont House where we can enjoy a walk around Mrs. Clutterbuck's beautiful garden, and a farm visit to the home of Lyburn cheese. We have also been awarded a grant to enable us to celebrate the forthcoming coronation with a party and 'Royal Quiz' on Tuesday 9th May. We foresee a busy time ahead. Next month we hope to hear John Wood tell us of his life as Head Gardener at Hinton Ampner. This will be on Tuesday 11th April at 7.30pm.

GET FREE EXTRA SUPPORT DURING POWER CUTS

Register for Priority Services

Scottish and Southern Electricity Networks (SSEN) maintains a register of people who may need special support in the event of a power failure.

SSEN is the company that operates the electricity network in this area of the country, and is distinct from the company that sends people electricity bills.

You may want to be on SSEN's register if you:

- Are deaf or hard of hearing
- Have a disability
- Live with children under five
- Are blind or partially sighted
- Have a chronic illness
- Use medical equipment/aids reliant on electricity
- Are over 60
- Temporarily need extra support

SSEN aims to offer:

Priority treatment during planned or unplanned power cuts

The Priority Services line is available 24 hours a day. They will contact you, or your nominated contact, if they need to switch off your power to carry out essential maintenance.

Connection to local emergency services

They work with local authorities, emergency services, and agencies like the Red Cross, to provide extra support to people on the Priority Services Register.

Emergency power supplies

If you use medical equipment/aids reliant on electricity, they aim to provide extra support during prolonged supply interruptions.

Safety advice tailored to your needs

When requested, they will offer you advice on how to prepare for a power cut, in a format that suits your needs, e.g. Braille, textphone, Easy Read, audio CD, or a language other than English.

Provisions for your community

During severe weather events and prolonged power outages their access to local welfare vehicles helps them to provide meals, drinks, warmth and charging points.

Peace of mind

They offer a service where you can agree a

- Ensure that you have essential medication to hand.
